

## Overview teaching formats, teaching materials and tools for digital teaching

The faculty offers different courses, e.g. large lectures such as the compulsory modules of the bachelor courses, but also smaller lectures such as the modules of the elective catalogues in the bachelor and master courses.

Very different tools are available, and these vary according to the application, especially the number of students in the course and the type of content.

In general:

**Information on the respective courses**  
are made available via Moodle rooms

**Materials for the respective courses**  
are made available via moodle rooms

To the modules applies:

**Smaller lectures (elective lectures in the Bachelor and Master programs)**

The lectures are usually offered online as webinar/Webco (e.g. with ZOOM, Webex or other tools) or offline as streaming or download. Offline everything is also provided via the streaming server of the TU Dortmund University. Please note the announcements of the lecturers for each course.

**Practical courses/ lab courses**

are offered, if software-based is possible;  
all other practical courses/ lab courses requiring the entry into a laboratory will probably be offered at a later time during the lecture period or during the semester break, depending on the development of the Covid-19 situation. Please note the announcements of the lecturers for each course.

Solutions still need to be found for several points:

**Study achievements**

Compulsory exercises or tests, which are a prerequisite for participation in an examination, will probably be replaced by compulsory tests or other alternatives. Please note the announcements of the lecturers for each course.

**Practical courses/ lab courses accompanying lectures**

Whether and under what conditions practical courses/ lab courses, if they are not software-based, can take place and which serve as a prerequisite for taking an exam, is currently still being clarified. You will be informed regularly and we would like to ask you to inquire regularly with the teaching units. The feasibility of internship modules is also currently being clarified.

**Seminars (small groups) with compulsory attendance**

will be replaced, if necessary, depending on the subject, by compulsory tests for the processing of exercise notes or other alternatives. In addition, there will be online tutorials and exercises with the possibility for further questions (e.g. with ZOOM or Webex or other tools). This information is not yet binding. You will be informed regularly and we would like to ask you at this point to inquire regularly with the lecturers as well.

**Compulsory exercises (intermediate tests)**

Compulsory exercises or intermediate tests that must be passed for admission to examinations are replaced, if necessary, by other similar formats, such as electronic output of tasks that must be solved and submitted electronically within a certain period of a few hours. Please note the announcements of the lecturers for each course.
